

## **Hold Fast**

Hebrews 10:19-25 stands at a powerful turning point in the epistle. After demonstrating the superiority of Christ and the New Covenant, the writer calls God's people to live in light of those truths. Christianity is not merely a system of beliefs to admire from a distance; it is a life of faithful devotion made possible by the finished work of Jesus Christ.

First, because Jesus has opened a new and living way into the presence of God, we are urged to draw near with a true heart in full assurance of faith. Under the old system, access was limited, but through the blood of Christ we may come before God with confidence, sincerity, and trust. What a blessing it is to know that our Savior has made the way open for us to approach the Father.

Second, we are told to hold fast the confession of our hope without wavering. The Christian life requires steadfastness. There will always be pressures, disappointments, and temptations to drift, but the foundation of our hope is not in ourselves. It is in the faithfulness of God. He who promised is faithful, and because He never fails, His people must remain firm in the hope they confess.

Third, we are called to consider one another in order to stir up love and good works. Faithfulness is not meant to be lived in isolation. God designed His people to strengthen, exhort, and encourage one another, especially through faithful assembly. Every time Christians gather, there is an opportunity to build one another up and to help keep each other steadfast as the Day approaches.

May we never forget that the superiority of Christ and the New Covenant are not simply doctrines to defend, but truths to live. Let us draw near, hold fast, and encourage one another so that we may continue faithfully in the path the Lord has set before us.
